What is Upward Bound?

Upward Bound is a federally funded program created in 1965 as part of the Higher Education Act. Funding is now provided by the U.S. Department of Education. Upward Bound is an educational program designed to develop the skills and motivation necessary for students' success in education beyond high school. The Missouri State University Upward Bound program is comprised of 9th-12th grade students from Central, Parkview, and Hillcrest High Schools. During the academic year, students meet weekly with the Upward Bound Academic Coordinator and Graduate Assistant, participate in specified Saturday Sessions, and attend individual advising sessions. During the summer, participants may receive instruction in mathematics, science, literature and composition, foreign language, computer applications, study skills, and other disciplines for six weeks on the campus of Missouri State University. Students from the schools mentioned above must apply and be accepted to be in the program.

How Do We Know We Are Successful?

Parents/Guardians and students often wonder how we measure our success as an educational program. The U. S Department of Education measures our success on the following five objectives:

- ☐ That we have at least 54 eligible students in the program at all times.
- □ 33% of participants served during the project year will have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale at the end of the school year.
- □ 33% of all Upward Bound seniors served during the project year will have achieved proficient level on state assessments in reading/language arts and math.
- 95% of project participants served during the project year will continue in school for the next academic year, at the next grade level, or will have graduated from secondary school with a regular secondary school diploma.
- □ 30% of all current and prior year UB participants, who at the time of entrance into the project had an expected high school graduation date in the school year, will complete a rigorous secondary school program of study and graduate in that school year with a regular secondary school diploma.
- 62% of all UB participants, who at the time of entrance into the project had an expected graduation date in the school year, will enroll in a program of postsecondary education by the fall term immediately following high school graduation, or will have received notification, by the fall term immediately following high school, from an institution of higher education, of acceptance but deferred enrollment until the next academic semester (e.g. spring semester).
- □ 75% of all participants, who enrolled in a program of postsecondary education, by the fall term immediately following high school graduation or by the next academic term (e.g., spring term) because of acceptance by deferred enrollment, will attain either an associate or bachelor's degree within six years following graduation from high school

The Missouri State University Upward Bound program tracks involvement with students; we monitor students' personal and academic achievements. The success of Upward Bound has been incredible. We aim to reach 100% college enrollment at the end of every year!



What is Expected of Students?

Student Commitment - I agree to:

- Attend all mandated events- weekly meetings, individual advising, and scheduled Saturday Sessions
- □ Attend high school: scheduled classes, labs, and discussions regularly.
- □ Enroll in a rigorous core program (4 years each of Math and English, and 3 years each of Science and Social Studies) in accordance with entrance requirements for the Missouri University System and successfully complete 1 credit of foreign language
- □ Strive to achieve a quarterly GPA of 2.5 or better. Students are allowed one (1) quarter after acceptance to achieve this goal.
- Complete the annual needs assessment and semester Educational Action Plan (EAP)
- □ Engage in monthly cultural activities, enrichment, and workshops with UB staff when given permission.
- Attend at least one summer academy during their participation in Upward Bound.

Student Behavior

It is a privilege to be a participant in the Upward Bound Program. With this privilege comes higher expectations of student behavior, attitude, and self-conduct for participants when compared to their non-Upward Bound peers. <u>Participants should at all times display behavior and attitudes that are respectful, positive, and appropriate, and bring credit to themselves, their guardians, their school, and the UB program.</u>

Behavior Policies of Upward Participants are as follows:

- Use of Technology: Any student caught using their cell phone or other technology during structured Upward Bound activities risks having the item confiscated.
 Furthermore, any form of cyberbullying between Upward Bound students is prohibited.
- Theft: Students suspected beyond a reasonable doubt of stealing other people's
 property are subject to suspension. However, students are responsible for keeping
 track of their personal belongings and are encouraged to label valuable belongings
 brought to Upward Bound activities. Upward Bound is NOT responsible for lost,
 stolen, or damaged items.
- Vandalism: No acts of public or private property destruction, no matter how small, are acceptable.
- Sexual Misconduct: No sexual misconduct or public displays of affection in any manner will be tolerated.
- Respect for Others: Any student will be reprimanded if they behave in a manner that is immature, negatively affecting the collective group, irresponsible, and unsafe. This includes disrespect and the use of profanity.



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Any violation of these rules subjects students to be put on probation and if applicable immediately sent home at the expense of the student and/ or parent/guardian. The probation will remain in effect until the staff has time to meet and determine the date that the probation will be removed, or if dismissal from the program is appropriate. The student will be notified of staff decisions within 1 week of when a student is put on probation. During probation the student will not be allowed to participate in UB-sponsored activities or events.

Immediate/ Automatic Dismissal (BIG THREE) from the program will occur if a student engages in either of the following activities/ behaviors:

- Aggressive Behavior to any staff, faculty, peers, participants of the Upward Bound Program, and/ or partners and stakeholders of the program. This includes physical fighting.
- Bullying and Harassment Behavior to any staff, faculty, peers, participants of the Upward Bound Program, and/ or partners and stakeholders of the program
- Use/ Possession of Alcohol, Weapons, Drugs, or Tobacco: No use or possession of alcohol, weapons (including pocketknives), drugs, marijuana, tobacco, and other illicit drugs is allowed.

NOTE: *Staff has the right to make adaptations and modifications when deemed necessary and appropriate, and reserves the right to assess and initiate corrective action on a case-by-case basis.

Expectations of Parents/ Guardians

As part of the Upward Bound application process parent(s)/guardian(s) sign a commitment contract where they have agreed to:

- 1. Grant permission for their student to participate in the UB program.
- 2. Fully support and facilitate their student's involvement in the UB program.
- 3. Support Upward Bound Staff by agreeing to the policies set forth as to how programming is conducted and how the project is run.
- 4. Attend UB activities that involve guardian representation/attendance during the vear.

Fully supporting your student's involvement may include providing transportation to an activity, providing lunch for your student when a meal is not provided by UB, sharing ideas and feedback with UB staff, and attending parent/guardian meetings and events as scheduled. We are always open to your ideas for other ways to get parents/guardians involved. Your involvement in parent/guardian meetings and events is expected, though we understand you may not be able to attend each time.



UB Academic Year Calendar 2023-2024

All Weekly meetings, Saturday Sessions, advising meetings, and Tutoring* are mandatory! Attendance at Saturday Academy sessions is required for ALL students BASED ON GRADE LEVEL. The schedule is set now for the entire semester; however, students will receive reminders in their in-school UB meetings, via messaging apps, and on the UB website. If a student is aware of an excused absence, this needs to be outlined in writing by the parent/guardian via the excused absence form and provided to the Academic Coordinator or Graduate Assistant.

*Tutoring: Students with GPAs below 2.5 are required to attend tutoring.

Attendance Probation

If a student has excessive absences during the year resulting in less than 25% participation, the student will be placed on a month-long participation probation and staff will evaluate whether there is true commitment toward participating in Upward Bound. The course of action may be loss of cultural/social privileges, exclusion from trips, and/or possible dismissal from the program. If a student has any issues, concerns, or questions they may discuss these with Upward Bound Staff

UB Ambassadors

We are excited to be rolling out a leadership group: The Upward Bound Ambassadors. This leadership group will consist of six 10th − 11th-grade students (GPA 2.75≤)− two from each partner school. As an Ambassador, you'll be the bridge between students and administration, driving positive change through your ideas and initiatives. You will plan impactful service projects, lead engaging events, and develop crucial leadership skills. Applications open in early November, with selections in December for a term spanning spring to fall semesters. Stand out, make friends, and leave a lasting legacy with the UB Ambassadors. The UB Ambassadors will meet with Ms. Ratcliff on the last Monday of the month at various coffee shops, restaurants, and/or other spots in town from 4 p.m. − 5 p.m. Because of this, reliable transportation is a must for these students. UB Ambassadors will be rewarded for their service with a \$50 gift card to the MSU bookstore per semester (total gift amount of \$100). If you're motivated, enthusiastic, and ready to lead, we invite you to join the UB Ambassadors. Together, we'll create an Upward Bound experience that reflects your aspirations and sets the stage for a brighter future. Application information is forthcoming.



RSVP Procedure

To control program costs, students will be expected to RSVP for all trips, and cultural and social events. An RSVP form will be sent to students prior to the event. If applicable a flyer & permission slip will be distributed to each student prior to the trip with a specified date of return. All forms must be completed/returned to the UB Coordinator, to their school counseling office, via a messaging platform, such as email or phone, or returned to the UB office on the MSU campus by the date specified for the student to be considered for the event. All students who have committed are expected to attend. We are a grant-funded program with limited funds, and we do not want to waste money that could be better spent elsewhere.

<u>Cultural/ Social Events Statement of Expectation</u>

Optional and voluntary cultural and social event opportunities will be offered for Upward Bound Students to attend. These events may at times be sponsored by Missouri State University which are created, curated, and intended for the college-age demographic. MSU-sponsored events align with university policies and are designed to reflect the mission, vision, and values of the institution. Students and guardians are expected to have discussions prior to attending all voluntary events discussing the content and activities of the event. Should questions arise concerning event specifics, guardians and/or students may call the TRIO office to receive further details. Permission from guardians should be given before students RSVP to an event. RSVPing to such events is mandatory for staffing and logistic purposes.

Personal Safety Policy:

- Personal Safety Products items (excluding pocketknives) are permissible for students to have during structured Upward Bound activities. This includes overnight travel. Items must be specifically designed and used for self-defense purposes only.
- If a student does bring a personal safety item to an event, they must notify Upward Bound staff at the beginning of the activity about what they brought/have with them.
- Staff reserves the right to determine whether the item brought is a permissible personal safety item or does not meet the criteria and may confiscate the item until after the event.
- During activities, staff may also have undisclosed personal safety items with them in case of emergent situations.



Stipend

What Is A Stipend

To further motivate students toward achieving the objectives of Upward Bound, we will be distributing stipends to students on a semester basis and to students who participate in Summer Academic Academy. In calculating each individual's stipend, students may earn up to \$100 per semester and \$60 per month during Summer Academy based on participation at required UB activities and grades.

How Do Students Earn One?

Academic Year:

First and foremost, students must attend all mandated Upward Bound Activities. Students must either have not missed any mandated events OR have an excused absence form on file to receive stipends. Semester stipends are then based on GPA. Students whose unweighted <u>GPA is 3.0 - 3.49</u> at the end of the semester will receive **\$50**. Students whose unweighted <u>GPA is 3.5 or above</u> at the end of the semester will receive **\$100**. Students will have the option to select a one-time (End of Academic year) or two-time (Semester) payout.

Summer Academy:

Summer Stipend Criteria is based on attendance and passing grades. Please see the chart below for Summer Academy stipend breakdown.

Summer Stipend Criteria	Amount (Stackable, not to exceed \$60)
Attendance at Summer Academy with limited absences (3 days or up to 20 hours)	\$30
Passing grades in all summer coursework	\$30

NOTE: Students who do not participate in the Summer Academy do not receive summer stipends
